Sample Population: 1934 registered voters in states with Democratic primaries and caucuses between February 22, 2020 and March 17, 2020 (Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Illinois, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, and Washington).

Sample Selection: Scientific online poll - stratified sample of panel respondents.
Weighting Parameters: The sample was weighted based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Voting and Registration Supplement to the Current Population Survey for registered voters in the aforementioned states based on age, gender, race, educational attainment, Census region, and Hispanic ethnicity.

Figures may or may not sum to $100 \%$ and this is due to the effects of rounding and weighting. The standard deviation of the weights was: 0.2408877 . The maximum weight was: 1.6995448 . The minimum weight was: $0.4344328 .95 \%$ of the weights were between $0.5688108,1.4836099$.

Margin of Error: The $95 \%$ credibility interval for this survey is $+/-2.3 \%$, which includes the square root of the design effect (DEFT): 1.0285897.

Sample Selection: Scientific online poll - stratified sample of panel respondents.
Weighting Parameters: The sample was weighted based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Voting and Registration Supplement to the Current Population Survey for registered voters in the aforementioned states based on age, gender, race, educational attainment, Census region, and Hispanic ethnicity.

Figures may or may not sum to $100 \%$ and this is due to the effects of rounding and weighting. The standard deviation of the weights was: 0.2408877 . The maximum weight was: 1.6995448 .
